

Access & the Disability Discrimination Act

The Disability Discrimination Act 1995 (DDA) gives disabled people the right to access goods, services & premises. Service providers must make reasonable adjustments to ensure people are not discriminated against because they are disabled.

Everyday activities, such as being able to go to a restaurant, shopping for clothes or food, using the local library, going to church or visiting a solicitor or doctor are all covered by the act.

Access groups & guides

Access groups, made up of disabled people, work with local councils, businesses & organisations to ensure the views of disabled people are represented when access to buildings & the environment is being considered. Contacts for the access groups are listed on pages 9 & 10. Access guides are produced by access groups and/or local councils and give useful local information on access to shops, restaurants, leisure facilities etc in a town or area. RADAR toilet keys

RadAR keys enable disabled people to use the 7,000 accessible public toilets around the country. The keys cost £3.50 from the local council (see page 10) or RADAR ☎ 020 7250 3222. 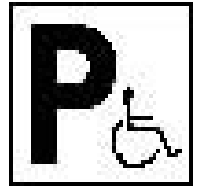

Driving & parking

Social car schemes

Are run by volunteers for their neighbourhoods & many provide transport for hospital visits, dental appointments or going shopping etc. Local disability information services have details on the schemes see page 10.



Motability & car adaptations

Motability ☎ 0845 456 4566 is a national charity set up to assist disabled people with leasing or buying a car, scooter or powered wheelchair. It is available to disabled people receiving Disability Living Allowance high rate mobility. Assessment for car adaptations can be arranged through the Queen Elizabeth's Foundation Mobility Centre ☎ 0208 770 1151.

Blue badges & parking bays

Blue badges are issued by Surrey County Council ☎ 08456 009009 for people with permanent disabilities & cost £2.00 for three years. The disabled person must be age 2 or over. The badge can be used by the disabled driver or passenger.

To qualify a disabled person must meet **one** of these conditions: be registered blind; have a permanent & substantial disability that makes walking impossible or very difficult; receive a war pensioner's mobility supplement; receive DLA high rate mobility; be unable to turn a steering wheel by hand, even with a turning knob; receive a grant towards their own vehicle or use a vehicle supplied by a government department.

Those with mobility problems that mean they are unable to move easily from a car to their home can apply for a disabled parking bay . Contact Surrey County Council ☎ 08456 009009 who can advise.

Dial-a-Ride Schemes

Dial a Ride buses are operated by borough & district councils see page 10 for people with limited mobility. They are door to door services with fares comparable to a standard bus fare & need to be booked in advance. All buses are wheelchair accessible. They operate during the day time, usually within borough or district boundaries.

Accessible taxis

Wheelchair users who need to remain in their wheelchairs can contact the local disability information services on page 10 for taxi information. Since 2000 all licensed taxis (black cabs) in London have had to be wheelchair accessible. Taxis & minicabs are required by law to carry assistance dogs free, unless the driver is exempt for medical reasons.



Disabled Person's Railcard

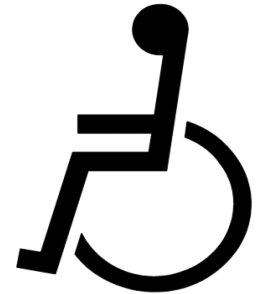
The railcard entitles disabled people (from age 5 upwards) and travel companions to discounted rail fares. It costs £18 for one year and £48 for three years (2007/08) ☎ 0845 605 0525.

To qualify, a disabled person must meet *at least one* of these conditions: be registered blind or partially sighted, or deaf or use an NHS hearing aid, have repeated epilepsy seizures, get AA or DLA mobility at any rate, or middle or high rate care for at least a year, get Severe Disablement Allowance or long-term Incapacity Benefit or War Pensioner's Mobility Supplement or War or Service Disablement Pension or have a Motability vehicle.



Accessible venues for meetings

Always check that the venue is suitable & can accommodate the numbers of people expected to attend. Check there is adequate parking, that the venue is wheelchair accessible, has accessible toilets, a loop system & easy-to-read signage. All local authorities have online directories of venues to hire in their areas which contain access information, see page 10.

Holidays & tourist attractions

Information on wheelchair accessible paths & walks around Surrey can be found in Surrey County Council's booklet 'Easy Access Around Surrey' ☎ 08456 009009.

Most visitor attractions now have provision for disabled visitors, but it is advisable to contact them direct to talk about individual needs. English Heritage ☎ 0870 333 1181 and the National Trust ☎ 0870 458 4000 have free access guides for disabled visitors. Tourist Information Centres have information on local places to visit - Guildford Centre ☎ 01483 444333, Woking Centre ☎ 01483 720103, Haslemere ☎ 01428 645425 & Dorking ☎ 01306 879327.

Theatres & cinemas

The main cinemas and theatres in Surrey have wheelchair spaces and disabled toilets. Parking varies and some cinemas require an escort to accompany a disabled visitor. Some also have loop systems and on occasions special signed or subtitled performances, but check beforehand. The Cinema Exhibitors' Assoc Card entitles some disabled people to free tickets for those accompanying them to the cinema ☎ 0151 348 8020.

Leisure activities

Libraries across the county are wheelchair accessible, but Books on Wheels will visit people at home who are unable to go out. Contact Surrey County Council ☎ 08456 009009

Public & Community Transport

Bus terminals, railway stations, airports & ports must be accessible to disabled people, as must any services they provide like ticket booking or travel information.

There are separate regulations that set out when buses, coaches and trains must be made accessible to disabled people, as the transport provisions of the DDA are being phased in over a number of years. Air travel is exempt from the act.

All new buses in use since 2000 are accessible and these are gradually being introduced across Surrey. All buses must be accessible by 2017 and coaches from 2020. New trains must be accessible from 1999 and all rail transport by 2020.

Demand responsive transport (DRT)

DRT buses do not have a set timetable. Their routes are determined by the requests of the passengers. Services are open to anyone. Journeys need to be booked in advance and are wheelchair accessible.
