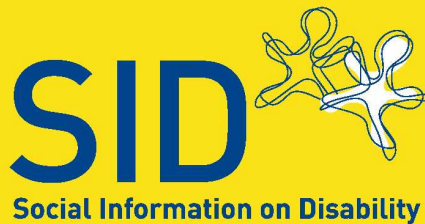

Equipment loan & hire for short term

use

If a wheelchair, raised toilet seat or other small item is only needed for a short period of time it can be loaned from the British Red Cross ☎ 01483 723473 or hired from voluntary organisations, such as Voluntary Association for Surrey Disabled (VASD) ☎ 01306 741500 or from some local Age Concern groups, or commercial companies.

Holidays, tourist attractions & RADAR keys

Visitor attractions, such as National Trust properties have wheelchairs and scooters for visitors to use. Surrey Tourist Information Centres have details: Guildford Centre ☎ 01483 444333, Woking Centre ☎ 01483 720103, Haslemere (01428 645425 & Dorking ☎ 01306 879324.

Tourism for All ☎0845 124 9971 have information on accessible hotels & self catering accommodation with specialised equipment like hoists & wheel-in showers. The National Accessible Standards grading scheme is used around the UK to grade holiday accommodation according to levels of accessibility.

RADAR toilet keys cost £3.50 from the local council (page 10) or RADAR ☎020 750 3222 Most areas of the country have local disability information services which can advise on local equipment hire or loan in their region. Contact SID ☎0800 0439395 for details.



Assessments for basic equipment & alarms

Patients discharged from hospital should have a plan devised while in hospital to include any equipment & support they may need from relatives, health professionals & social services.

An assessment can be requested from Surrey social services ☎ 08456 009009 and can entitle the disabled person and carer to equipment that can help with everyday activities like bathing, sitting & sleeping. Community alarm services (24 hrs) are run by Age Concern Surrey ☎ 01483 503414, Help the Aged ☎ 0207 278 1114 & local authorities (see page 10), who also run Telecare services which provide bed sensors, fall detectors & other equipment linked into their community alarms service (see page 10). Carers are also be entitled to an assessment of their needs from social services if they provide regular and substantial care to a disabled person.

Assessments for sight & hearing difficulties

SAVI ☎ 01372 377701 assess visually impaired people for equipment & services.

Surrey Deaf Services Team ☎ 01372 376558 assess hearing impaired people for equipment & services.

Wheelchair, scooter & driving assessments

NHS wheelchairs are provided after an assessment at a wheelchair assessment centre. Referral is by a GP. NHS wheelchair vouchers can be used towards buying a more expensive wheelchair privately after an assessment.

Queen Elizabeth's Mobility Centre ☎ 0208 770 1151 offers private assessments for using scooters and driving cars.

Medical equipment is available from the NHS and new equipment may be available from social services after an assessment (see page 4) or purchased from specialist shops:

AbilityNet ☎ 0800 269545 can advise on computer software and equipment to meet different disability needs.

Free TV licences are available to all people aged 75+ and entitlement is automatic.

Digital UK ☎ 0800 519 2021 has information on help for disabled people on switching over to digital TV.

Some stair lift manufacturers will buy back recently purchased stair lifts, but more usually a charge will be made to remove them

Donating second hand disability equipment

It can be difficult to dispose of specialist items quickly. Beds & chairs may be taken by a local hospice or care home if they meet their requirements.

GBL Wheelchair Services ☎ 0208 867 2461 accept manual wheelchairs for refurbishment & Through the Roof ☎ 01372 749955 will take donations of children's wheelchairs to send overseas.

Adaptations to homes & buildings



For general advice on adapting buildings contact the Centre for Accessible Environments ☎ 0207 840 0125.

Care & Repair ☎ 0115 950 6500 have local agencies who give advice on grants and practical help with adaptations.

Home handyman schemes run by local authorities (page 10) can fit small aids & do simple home repairs for a fixed charge.

Buy With Confidence scheme ☎ 01372 371700 lists tradesmen approved by Surrey Trading Standards www.surreycc.gov.uk.

Disabled Facilities Grants from local authorities (page 10) can help pay for essential adaptations to the home. Grants are means-tested and can be up to £25,000. Grants for children under age 19 are not means-tested.

Occupational Therapists in private practice can advise on equipment & adaptations. Contact SID ☎ 0800 0439395.

Adaptations for work

Access to Work ☎ 01273 364750 can provide funding for equipment for disabled employees & towards adaptations to work premises, as well as support for transport to work.



Finance & benefits

VAT exemption

Some types of construction work, vehicles & equipment designed or adapted to help disabled people are exempt from VAT. Contact the VAT Helpline

☎ 0845 010 9000.



Benefits & Motability

Disability Living Allowance (DLA) is paid to disabled people with care and/or mobility needs, aged 65 or under. They are unaffected by savings and paid in addition to other benefits. The high rate mobility component of DLA can be used towards a Motability ☎ 0845 456 4566 car or electric wheelchair & exempts the person from paying Vehicle Excise Duty (road tax).

Attendance Allowance (AA) is paid to people over age 65 who have care needs. Application packs for DLA & AA can be obtained from the Benefit Enquiry Line ☎ 0800 882200. Citizens Advice Bureaux www.citizensadvice.org.uk do checks on entitlement to benefits. Disability information services (page 10) can advise on getting help with filling in forms.

Trade unions, charities & trusts

Trade unions & professional bodies may help past & present members on a low income with the cost of buying aids & equipment. www.joblinks.org.uk lists charities related to occupations. Contact SID ☎ 0800 0439395 for other sources of charitable funding. Ex service personnel & relatives can contact SSAFA ☎ 01252 837782 & Royal British Legion ☎ 01372 386500 for assistance.
